General Report Comments: Upon arrival at the property I found a group of about 4 men seated inside the shop eating. Anidessa introduced himself by this name and he told me that the cat has an owner but he was not available. He said I should contact him. He provided me with the owner's contact details but when I phoned the number immediately the phone was off, my call couldn't go through. I tried several times to no success. I spoke to Anidessa with other ladies whom I presume were the employees and they told me that the cat just came like this one day and they never sought any Veterinary treatment . They were well spoken and it was unfortunate they didn't find it serious or necessary to sought out help for the cat.

The cat appeared to be a young kitten approximately 5 month old and it was very friendly. The tail was badly injured and hanging. I told them that the cat needs to be seen to by a veterinarian and that i was going to take it to the Sandton SPCA. They agreed. I rushed the cat to the Sandton SPCA after they completed the form.

Upon arrival at the Sandton SPCA clinic I presented the kitten to Dr Kelsey and we both discovered that the tail was broken. She further indicated that there was no longer any blood circulation on the tail and that the tail was dead.

At this particular point I completely realized that it was not safe to return the cat to an environment where an animal is injured and no reasonable care was sought to alleviate suffering and that it was necessary to find out what happened to the cat.
