General Report Comments: Mr Coch claimed that he was on his to out to run errands when I arrived at the property. He said I must maybe come back tomorrow for a the inspection. I told him that it was not possible whoever was on the property will walk around. He drove off while I insisted on carrying out the inspection by myself. While I was busy inspecting the pigs Mr. Nicholas Dube joined me as he holds a stake and a partner in the pig ownership. There were Geese, chickens and a ram of a sheep which appeared in a fairly acceptable condition. The nursing sows were held separately from other age range of pigs. The sows' sty was in disrepair, shelter not adequately in place. The pigsty gave an impression that they were poorly maintained and needed serious improvement. Food supply (fruits and vegetables) was in abundance as it gets donated by the local retailers. The issue is that the food is not presented to the pigs in a suitable manner or the leftovers are not managed properly. I advised them that when mixed with the manure, they can still easily be processed into a compostable waste to sell or use for crops. I also advised them that fencing and partitioning of pigsty will be necessary to prevent piglets from escaping. Flies were infested with no measures in place to minimize them. The pigs' general physical condition was satisfactorily acceptable. The main concern was the dirt living conditions under which they were kept. I issued them with a warning to rectify this within 72 hours or otherwise time-frame specified. To conduct a follow up inspection on Friday the 27th January 2023.
