General Report Comments: There were end-of-layer hens on sale outside the gate of the above property. The chickens were placed in a cage (3-layered but only 2 occupied) of poor repairs, open gaps, and dispositioned wires, and the floors could not hold onto heavyweight they were becoming uneven. The cage was exposed to sunlight and no accessible potable water was provided. We proceeded to view the chickens' night rooms where we discovered the rooms to be dirty and 10 chickens (Rock Plymouths) that they referred to as "Road-runners" and 3 rabbits. The night room was dirty and stinky when we looked through the windows. The "Road-runners" were kept in a blocked-off passageway very dirty, untidy and had hazardous foreign objects. The chicken coop was built on a towered deck but had not been cleaned for an unreasonable period. Nesting rooms were gathering a thick layer of manure. Their water was dirty as well as the food. Various metal rubble was left in the chicken's enclosure. Not controlling the chickens' movement as some of the chickens were going to neighbours' and coming back. A small rabbit cage was dirty with corn maize peels on the floor. Potable water for the rabbits was provided but they were exposed to unhygienic conditions. The owner of the chicken-selling business was renting a space from the owner, Mr Mtshweni to keep her chicken hawking business. I issued both of them a written warning to get their house together and keep it clean within 5 days. I persuaded them to surrender the rabbits because they were not even aware of their disease and no biosecurity were being practised. All 3 rabbits were surrendered to us.
