Comments and action taken by Inspector:

There was a lot of animals during the time of the inspection.

The animals just arrived as I was leaving. Amount g those animals I saw 16 Pygmy Falcons. When asked for any permits, none could be provided. I reported this to CapeNature. While waiting for them to arrive I saw one of the falcons showing signs that he might be in distress. He was hanging from the wired mesh with his back facing the water container. He had rapid breaths and his eyes were closed. This Animal was moved to a different place where there was a draft to keep them cool as we suspected heat stress.

When they arrived, we waited for the person who is supposed to collect the animal.

He arrived shortly after them. He says that they are Rescue birds that had been removed from a situation where their welfare were compromised. The place that sent the birds is called Avian One Rescue facility based in Gauteng. The animals was seized by CapeNature and taken to one of their birds of prey facilities.
