I have also noticed the people are away for several days and I also wonder if the dog has any food to eat during that time. I must thank you very much for having that makeshift kennel built for the dog which you will see when doing your inspection of the condition in which the dog is living.

The dog is tied to one spot next to the makeshift kennel and left there all alone, sometimes with no water during these hot days.

May I please ask that one of the inspectors just please inspect the living conditions of the dog?
