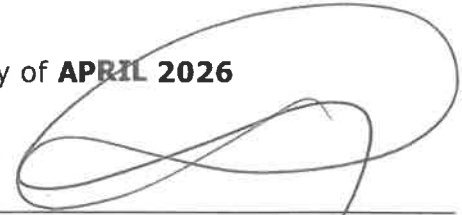

 - b. **Members of the City of Cape Town Metropolitan Police**
 - c. **Members of the City of Cape Town Law Enforcement**
 - d. **Members of the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (SPCA)**
5. Seize any animal/s and take it/them into your custody if it is reasonably necessary to prevent cruelty to or suffering of such animal/s.
6. Deal with it/them according to law.

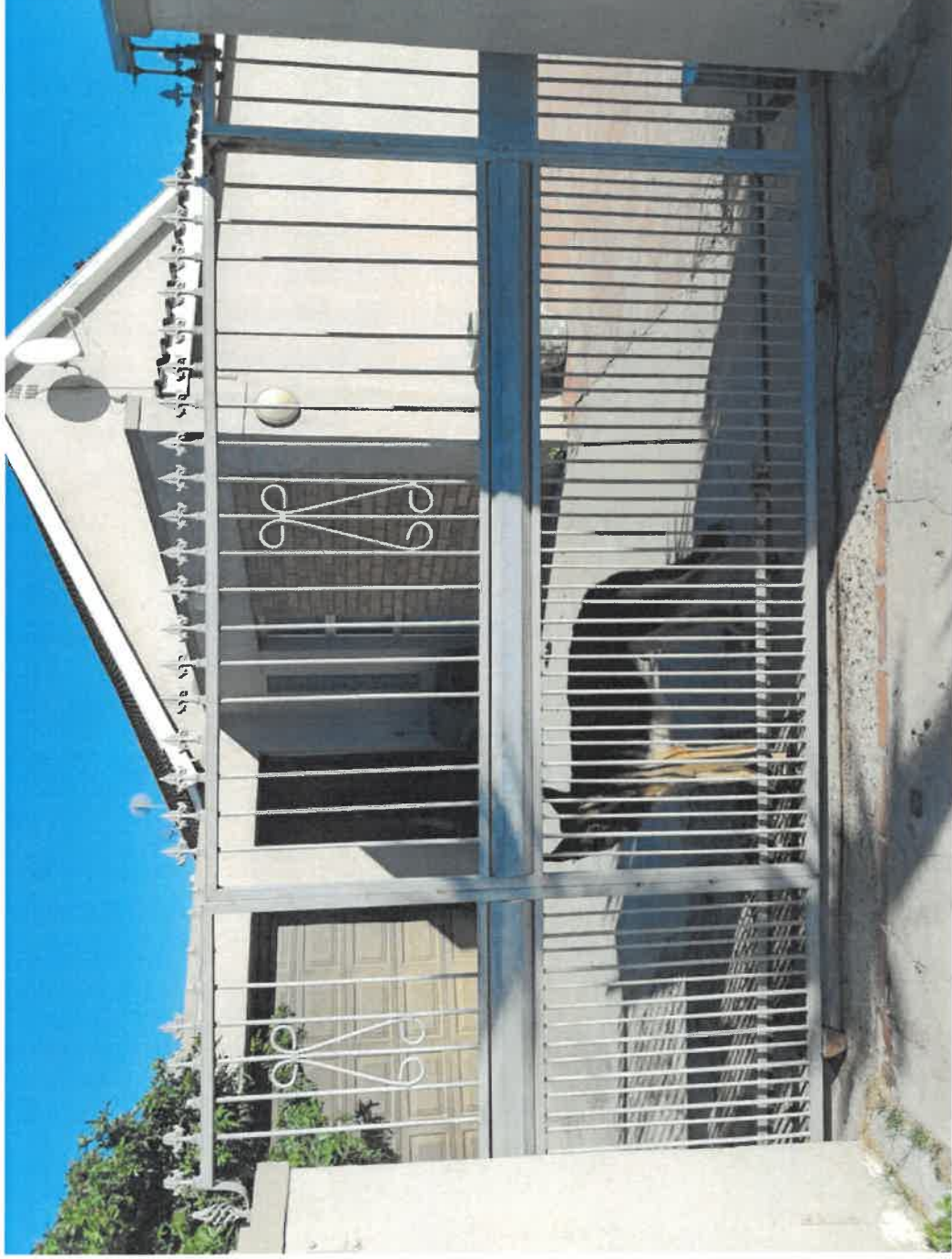

Affidavit – Veterinary Report

I, **Dr. Leon Hector**, hereby make oath and declare in English as follows:

1.

I am an adult male veterinarian registered with the South African Veterinary Council (SAVC) under registration number CS25/19195. I hold a Bachelor of Veterinary Science degree (BVSc). I am currently employed by the Cape of Good Hope SPCA. I am competent to provide veterinary services and experienced in identifying clinical signs of neglect and cruelty in animals.

2.

The facts contained in this affidavit fall within my personal knowledge unless indicated otherwise or unless it appears so from the context. The facts are also, to the best of my knowledge and belief, both true and correct.

3.

On 22 April 2026, I conducted a clinical examination on a canine admitted into the care of the Cape of Good Hope SPCA. The animal had been seized from a property situated at 28 Derek Road, Lotus River, Cape Town, by Inspector Siviwe Noko under SPCA case number INSP229684.

3.1. ANIMAL INFORMATION:

The details of the animal are as follows:

- **Admission Number:** A98528
- **Species:** Canine
- **Breed:** German Shepard
- **Sex and Reproductive Status:** Male, intact
- **Colour and Markings:** Tan and Black
- **Microchip:** Unknown
- **Name:** Unknown

3.2. CLINICAL EXAMINATION FINDINGS:

Upon clinical examination, the following findings were recorded:

- **Body Condition Score:** 3/9 (underweight)
- **Weight:** 20 kg
- **Behaviour:** Bright, alert and responsive.
- **External Parasites:** None observed at the time of examination
- **Dentition and Nails:** Good condition, with slight tartar staining present on the teeth
- **Eyes:** Within normal limits
- **Additional clinically significant findings:** No clinically significant abnormalities detected

I, **Dr. Leon Hector**, hereby further make oath and declare in English as follows:

4.

VETERINARY OPINION:

Based on the clinical examination findings, the animal was assessed as being underweight, with a body condition score of 3/9, which is below the acceptable range for a healthy adult German Shepherd.

The most likely cause of the dog's poor body condition is inadequate nutrition. This may arise from the provision of insufficient quantities of food, the provision of food of inadequate nutritional value, irregular feeding practices, or a combination thereof.

In addition, where routine veterinary preventative care is lacking, particularly regular deworming, intestinal parasite infestations may develop and contribute significantly to weight loss and poor body condition. Internal parasites compete with the host for nutrients and can impair the animal's ability to maintain a healthy weight despite food intake.

A body condition score of 3/9 indicates a state of chronic undernourishment. In this animal, prominent skeletal structures and reduced body reserves are consistent with prolonged inadequate nutritional intake. Such a condition negatively impacts the animal's welfare and predisposes it to impaired immune function, reduced resilience to disease, decreased energy levels, and a diminished quality of life.

5.

PROGNOSIS AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

The prognosis for this animal is considered good, provided that appropriate corrective measures are implemented.

The following recommendations are made:

- Provision of a nutritionally balanced, good-quality diet in quantities sufficient to maintain an ideal body condition
- Administration of an appropriate broad-spectrum deworming treatment as prescribed or recommended by a veterinarian
- Implementation of an effective tick and flea control programme
- Regular monitoring of body weight and body condition score to ensure sustained improvement
- Ongoing veterinary assessments as required to monitor recovery and overall health status

6.

CONCLUSION

At the time of examination, the animal was underweight and in a compromised body condition consistent with prolonged inadequate nutrition and husbandry. In my professional opinion, this condition adversely affected the animal's welfare and resulted in unnecessary suffering.

In light of the animal's condition, the history of non-compliance, and the need to safeguard its future welfare, I am of the opinion that permanent confiscation of the animal should be considered. It would be in the best interests of the dog to be placed in the care of a suitable and responsible owner or organisation capable of providing adequate nutrition, husbandry, and veterinary care.

In my professional opinion, the dog was suffering unnecessarily as a result of its underweight condition. The suffering experienced by the animal was avoidable and could reasonably have

been prevented through the provision of adequate nutrition, appropriate husbandry practices, and routine veterinary care.

AFFIDAVIT

I, the undersigned

JONATHAN SIVIWE NOKO

(ID 9002206144088)

Do hereby make oath in English and state that

1. I am an adult male Cadet Inspector employed as such by the Cape of Good Hope Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals ("SPCA") at corner of 1st Avenue and First Road, Grassy Park with contact telephone number/s 021 700 4158/9 or 083 326 2377 and with email address insp7@spca-ct.co.za.
2. The facts contained herein fall within my personal knowledge, unless the contrary appears from the context or is expressly indicated otherwise, and are, to the best of my knowledge and belief, both true and correct.
3. On 18 March 2026, Inspector Julian van der Zandt attended the property and conducted an inspection. During the inspection, he observed an adult intact male German Shepherd dog which appeared markedly underweight, with prominent ribs and hip bones visible. A Warning Notice was issued to the person responsible for the animal, directing that appropriate remedial action be taken.
4. On 23 March 2026, Inspector van der Zandt conducted a follow-up inspection. Upon examination, he noted no discernible improvement in the dog's body condition. The animal remained underweight and a further Warning Notice was issued.
5. On 10 April 2026 at approximately 09h10, the matter was allocated to me for further investigation and intervention.
6. Upon my arrival at the property, I called out at the main gate. An adult male opened a window and I requested to speak with the owner of the dog. The male informed me that the owner was at work and advised that he had only moved onto the property two days prior. He further informed me that the owner utilised a separate entrance situated on the side of the property. The dog is said to be owned by Ms. Lisa Van Der Bergh with cell number 082 412 5804.
7. I proceeded to the side entrance where I observed the German Shepherd dog in question. The dog appeared underweight, with a poor body condition score. The animal was housed in a clean environment and had access to suitable shelter. I observed an empty bowl adjacent to the shelter, although I could not determine whether it was intended for drinking water. A partially open garage structure was present, which could potentially have contained additional water under cover.

I, **Jonathan Siviwe Noko**, do hereby make further oath in English and state that:

8. I noted that final warnings had already been issued by Inspector van der Zandt and that no response had been received from the owner. Despite previous interventions, the dog's underweight condition persisted.
9. On 11 April 2026 at approximately 11h00, I returned to the property. An adult female attended to me. I introduced myself and explained the purpose of my visit, including the fact that previous inspections had been conducted and notices left at the property without any response being received by the SPCA.
10. The female informed me that the dog had belonged to her late mother and alleged that following her mother's death, the dog became stressed and subsequently lost weight. She stated that the dog had previously been examined by a veterinarian and that they had allegedly been advised that the dog was grieving.
11. She denied receiving any previous notices or being aware of notices having been affixed to the property. The female further advised that the family was in the process of relocating as the property was being sold.
12. Although she refused me access through the residence, she escorted me to a side gate from where I was able to observe the dog. The animal had access to drinking water, suitable shelter, and was being kept in a clean environment. She refused permission for photographs to be taken.
13. I subsequently issued Notice to Comply No. 15904, attached hereto as per A5 requiring that the dog receive appropriate veterinary examination and treatment within 48 hours and that a veterinary report be furnished to the SPCA within the same period.
14. The female stated that her brother would take the dog to the SPCA Animal Hospital on the following Monday.
15. She refused to provide her identity number, declined to accept ownership of the dog, stating that it belonged to her deceased mother, and further refused to surrender the animal into SPCA care. Although she refused to sign the Notice to Comply, she accepted the document.
16. I am satisfied that Ms Van Der Bergh is indeed the owner of the dog as set out in the definitions in the Animals Protection Act, 71 of 1962, that Ms Van Der Bergh has possession and custody of the animal in question.
17. On 15 April 2026 at approximately 08h30, I conducted a further inspection of the property. At the front gate, I encountered a tenant identified as Mr Stevens. He informed me that he had been requested to transport the dog to a veterinarian but had been unable to load the animal into his vehicle. He stated that he had informed the owner that alternative arrangements would need to be made.
18. I again observed the dog. While the animal had access to food and sufficient drinking water, it remained visibly underweight.
19. I issued a final Notice to Comply, No. 15917, attached hereto as A6, directing that the dog receive veterinary treatment within 48 hours and that proof thereof, together with a veterinary report, be provided to the SPCA. Mr Stevens accepted and signed the Notice to Comply.

I, **Jonathan Siviwe Noko**, do hereby make further oath in English and state that:

20. On 17 April 2026 at approximately 15h10, I telephonically contacted Ms Lisa van der Bergh on cellular number 082 412 5804 to determine whether the dog had received veterinary treatment.
21. Ms van der Bergh advised that, to the best of her knowledge, arrangements had been made for the dog to be taken to a veterinarian.
22. I informed her that Mr Stevens had advised me that he had been unable to transport the dog and had requested that alternative arrangements be made.
23. Ms van der Bergh stated that she had not been informed of this development as she did not reside on the property. She indicated that she would make alternative arrangements.
24. When asked when such arrangements would be made, Ms van der Bergh became agitated and stated that she felt undue pressure was being placed upon her. She advised that she would attend to the matter when she was able to do so and terminated the call shortly thereafter.
25. Following the telephone conversation, I proceeded to the property. Upon arrival, the residence was closed and no person responded to my calls. I observed the dog from outside the property and noted that it remained underweight. The animal had access to drinking water and shelter, the enclosure appeared clean, and fresh faeces were present, indicating recent activity.
26. As repeated notices and directives had failed to secure veterinary treatment for the animal, I formed the reasonable belief that intervention was necessary to prevent further suffering and recommended that a warrant be obtained for the seizure of the dog.
27. On 21 April 2026, I applied for and obtained a warrant issued in terms of the Animals Protection Act 71 of 1962 authorising the seizure of the dog. I attended the property accompanied by members of Law Enforcement.
28. Upon arrival, I called out but received no response. I observed the dog from the gate and noted that it remained underweight and in poor body condition. As the gate was unlocked, I entered the property in terms of the authority granted by the warrant. The dog had access to drinking water and the environment appeared generally clean.
29. The dog was seized and safely loaded into the SPCA vehicle for transport.
30. A copy of the seizure notice (attached hereto as A8), together with the warrant application and warrant (attached hereto as A7), was affixed to the rear door of the residence.
31. Thereafter, I attended at Grassy Park SAPS where the seizure was officially recorded under OB No. 1919/04/2026.
32. Following the seizure, the animal was examined by Dr L.J. Hector, who compiled a veterinary affidavit detailing the animal's condition and professional findings.
33. Despite multiple inspections, repeated warning notices, two Notices to Comply, direct communication with persons responsible for the animal, and reasonable opportunities

being afforded to obtain veterinary treatment, the persons responsible for the dog failed to ensure that the animal received the veterinary attention necessary to address its persistently underweight condition.

35. I hereby request that the owner of the animals, Ms Lisa Van Der Bergh is charged with contravention of the Animals Protection Act, 71 of 1962, specifically:

a. Section 2(1)(a) for neglecting the dog

(a) overloads, overdrives, overrides, ill-treats, neglects, infuriates, tortures or maims or cruelly beats, kicks, goads or terrifies any animal, or causes or procures or, being the owner, permits any of these things to be done;

b. Section 2(1)(e) for failing to render or procure veterinary treatment

(e) being the owner of any animal, deliberately or negligently keeps such animal in a dirty or parasitic condition or allows it to become infested with external parasites or fails to render or procure veterinary or other medical treatment or attention which he is able to render or procure for any such animal in need of such treatment or attention, whether through disease, delivery of young or any other cause, or fails to destroy or cause to be destroyed any such animal which is so seriously injured or diseased or in such a physical condition that to prolong its life would be cruel and would cause such animal unnecessary suffering;

c. Section 2(1)(q) and Section 2(1)(r)

(q) causes, procures or assists in the commission or omission of any act of cruelty, or any act or omission which causes unnecessary suffering to any animal;

and

(r) by wantonly or unreasonably doing or omitting to do any act, or causing or procuring the commission or omission of any act, causes any unnecessary suffering to any animal;
