Thank you for taking my call.

As per our telephonic conversation, kindly see the email thread below regarding the complaint that I have submitted in September 2024.

To brief on it:

The situation has gotten to a worse point scenario. Those dogs mentioned in the initial email is still suffering at the hands of their owners. They claim that the animals are there to protect their mom.

1- They are chained up since day 1. The dogs are held in a secluded space with NO ROOM to move. Barking from early hours of the morning.

THEY DON'T SEE THE OUTSIDE WORLD, THEY DON'T GET WASHED, THEY DONT GET TO RUN FREELY A BIT IN FRESH AIR, THEY DON'T GET TO GO FOR WALKS, AS A MATTER OF FACT THEY DO NOT GET LOOKED AFTER OR CARED FOR LIKE THEY SHOULD. They are chained up 24/7

2- The mother is 86 year old with Dementia. The eldest son has a girlfriend who look after the mother. Both sons are in work during the day and even sometimes on a weekend as well.

3-Weas neighbors are left to listen to those dogs suffering and the barking is driving us up the wall for years now. We lose sleep, and also my niece who was currently in hospital and is in matric cannot study. I don't know if the dogs are even laying in their own dirt cos the stench that comes from the yard area, OMG, it is a health risk for us cos we cannot even open up our windows or doors for fresh air.

That's the tip of the iceberg.

I NEED SOMEONE FROM THE SPCA TO TAKE DRASTIC MEASURES TO CONFISCATE THE DOGS AND FIND A LOVING HOME FOR THEM. IT'S 2 GERMAN SHEPHERDS. THAT DOGS ARE LIVING IN AGONY!!
